## **McPhail Tree Farm Belton, South Carolina**

Speaker: Dr. Greg Yarrow, Wildlife Biologist, Clemson University

Information will be provided on food plot management and improving wildlife habitat by Dr. Greg Yarrow.

Equipment demonstrations will feature the Brush Master Pine Plantation Disc Harrow for utilizing the cutting lanes in newly thinned pine plantations for access, fire lanes and improving wildlife habitat. The harrow can be adjusted to straddle the row of stumps.

Pat Toole of Greenville Tractor will provide a demonstration of the Plot Master Ultimate Food Plot Machine. "Plot Master" is an all-in-one food plot planting implement that can disk, plow, level, plant and cover seeds in a way that virtually guarantees professional results.

From Anderson: Take U.S. Hwy 76 and 178 to Belton. Turn south on S.C. 20 for 3.7 miles and turn right on Carrol Road at Bratcher's Machine Shop. Go .7 miles to McPhail Tree Farm sign and turn right on the gravel road to parking area.

From Greenville: Take either Hwy 20 to Belton or U.S. 25 South to Ware Place and S.C. 247 to Belton. Go through the square and turn right on Hwy 20 by the train station at the red light. Go 300 feet and turn left on Hwy 20. Continue on Hwy 20 for 3.7 miles and turn right on Carrol Road at Bratcher's Machine Shop. Continue for .7 miles and turn right at McPhail's Tree Farm sign on the gravel road to the parking area.

From Honea Path: Go west 6.9 miles on S.C. 252. Then turn North on S.C. Hwy 20 for 2.5 miles to Bratcher's Machine Shop and turn left on Carrol Road. Continue .7 miles and turn right at McPhail's Tree Farm sign on the gravel road to parking area.
